

Certificate in Community Organizing for Climate Justice

A 9-month online program for faith-rooted teams ready to act for climate justice

Climate change is one of the defining moral issues of our time. People of faith bring unique values, networks, and commitments to justice that can spark powerful community action. This program invites faith leaders and communities from all traditions to join together in learning, relationship, and action for climate justice.

What You'll Gain

- Practical organizing skills
- Tools to engage your congregation in climate justice
- A network of faith-filled peers
- A concrete action plan to advance climate justice locally

Who Should Join?

- Teams ready to learn together, organize together, and act together.
- Teams can include any combination of faith leaders, lay leaders, and community members drawn to connect their spiritual values with environmental justice.
- Register with a team of 3 people from your congregation or faith group. There is no extra charge for adding more team members (up to 6 people).

Overview

- 100% online program runs January – November 2026, with holiday breaks and no sessions in August.
- Program follows three-week rhythm of workshop, small-group coaching, and practice, guiding teams to bring what they've learned into meaningful action in their own communities.
- Weekly time commitment: 3-5 hours split between virtual sessions (1-3 hours), readings & journals (est. 1 hour), team practice/homework (1-3 hours)
- Cost: \$1000 per team (sliding scale available).
